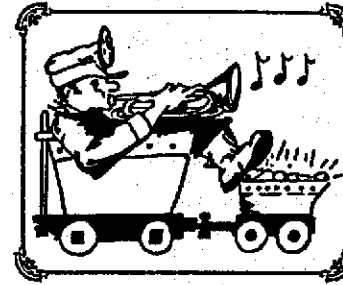

Concerts from the awning porch of the National Hotel in Nevada City, the old Jeffrey's Hall at Mill and Neal, the old Wisconsin's Hotel second story porch at Auburn and Main, and, of course, the porch of the Holbrooke Hotel in Grass Valley, filled the air with marches, overtures, waltzes, and reels.

The Nevada County Concert Band was later formed by Ernie Harries who was a Nevada City bank manager and professional musician. Playing its first formal concert in 1972, it has since participated in many community events and continues to be very active.

Michael McAllester, Assistant Professor of Music at North Carolina Wesleyan College, considers Nevada City to be his home town. He began playing trumpet in the Nevada County Concert Band in 1970, and graduated from Nevada Union High School in 1972. He attended Sierra College before moving on to California State University, Northridge, where in 1985 he completed a Bachelor of Music in Horn Performance while also studying conducting. Teaching and conducting were the ambitions that led him to the University of Southwestern Louisiana for his Master of Music in Conducting and eventually to his current teaching position. Mr. McAllister also conducts the Eastern North Carolina Wind Ensemble and serves as Music Director for the Playhouse Theater in Rocky Mount, NC. He is married to Elizabeth Branch (another NU graduate), now a clarinetist with the Raleigh Symphony. They have two children, Bryan and Emma, Both budding violinists.
