Art, music highlight AIDS benefit

n auction of about 70 pieces of fine art and music by pianist Paul Perry of Music in the Mountains
highlight the Sierra Foothills AIDS Foundation's third annual "All Dressed Up With Somewhere To Go" fund-raiser Sunday at Tofanelli's Cafe in Grass Valley.

The event starts at 6 p.m. and includes hors d'oeuvres donated by local restaurants, bakeries, caterers and delicatessens, and a wine bar featuring vintages donated by area wineries. Admission is \$20. Proceeds benefit the Sierra Foothills AIDS Foundations' efforts to help Nevada County residents living with HIV and AIDS and their families and partners.

The fund-raiser will enable Sierra Foothills AIDS Foundation to keep up with increasing demands for its services, said Jeff Cowan, executive director of the nonprofit organization.

'Right now, we're seeing an increase in caseload.

We're serving 130 people locally. Along with that increase, we've seen an increase in the number of treatments and the cost of treatments. We want to make sure everyone has treatment available to them," Cowan said.

Fine art and photography from Nevada, Placer and Sacramento county artists will be auctioned. The art includes paintings by Vibeke Woodbury, Tom Clark, Teddi Kell and students at Oak Tree School; photographs by Georganna Dean; garden sculpture by Metamorphosis; a Hopi belt buckle by Benny Armijo; origami by Daniel Brooks and two framed architectural prints by Frank Lloyd Wright.

"The artists really came out for us this year," Cowan said. He added that the minimum bids are greatly below retail prices for the art, giving bargain hunters and collectors a chance to obtain originals at a reduced price.

The art is on display this week in the restaurant's atrium. Bids may be made in a book prior to Sunday's reception-fund-raiser. Tofanelli's is at 302 W. Main St. For more information, call 477-5551.
