The band has a rich history dating to the days of the Cornish gold miners. Ernie Harries, who was a musician as well as a bank manager in Nevada City, formed the Nevada County Concert Band. Ever since its first formal concert in 1972, the band has been very active to participate in numerous community events. Our membership consists entirely of volunteers.

### Say 'Hello' To Our Conductor – G. 'Mancho' Gonzalez, Jr.

G. 'Mancho' Gonzalez, Jr., has a well-deserved reputation in the Sacramento area as a skilled band director and music educator. Mr. Gonzalez grew-up in Pacifica, California and received his B.A. in Music degree from San Jose State University and his Master in Music in Wind Conducting degree from California State University, Sacramento. He has studied with nationally-known conductors such as Robert Halseth of CSU, Sacramento, Jack Stamp of Indiana University, PA, Eugene Corporon of the University of North Texas, Frederick Fennell, Conductor Laureate of the Tokyo Kosei Wind Orchestra, Gary Hill of the University of Missouri/Kansas City, and John Whitwell of Michigan State University. Mr. Gonzalez has been music director of the River City Concert Band since 1994, and, as a trumpeter, he has played with the California Wind Orchestra and with community bands since 1980.

The scope of Mr. Gonzalez's career as a music educator includes elementary, junior high, high school, and university levels. He currently teaches classroom music at two elementary schools in the San Juan Unified School District and is the Director of Bands at Cosumnes River College, Sacramento.

He has guest-conducted several regional community bands and has served as guest conductor and clinician for the San Joaquin County Junior High Honor Band this last spring.

### Concert Announcer – Jack Stewart

In addition to his clarinet playing duties in the Nevada County Concert Band, Jack Stewart is the 'Voice of the NCCB', adding his sometimes ribald, usually humorous, and always informative commentary to the NCCB programs.

Jack has played clarinet in the NCCB since 1987. After playing in various school groups, Jack became a member of the Tenth Olympiad Band for the 1932 Los Angeles Olympic Games. This Olympiad band was a synthesis of four, smaller, 50-piece bands: band 'A' consisted of professional musicians, bands 'B' and 'C' consisted of high school volunteers, and band 'D' was made-up of members from the Pasadena Jr. College Band. Jack played in band 'C'.

In 1955, after a 20 year hiatus, Jack joined the Aahmes (Oakland) Shrine Temple band. He later played in the Castro Valley Community Band then in the Walnut Creek Concert Band and finally on to the Nevada County Concert Band.
