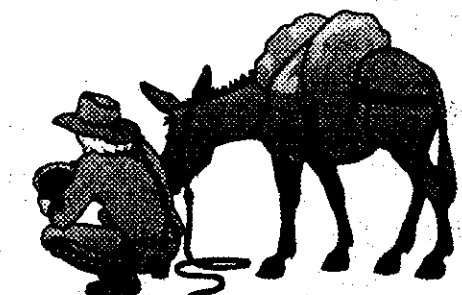

The Nevada County Concert Band began in the 1850's as an all-brass band organized by Cornish miner immigrants that played for parades and community celebrations. The Nevada County Concert Band grew out of these roots and has developed into one of the most active bands in the region. It is a group of 45 community volunteers of varying backgrounds with different levels of musical experience whose ages range from young students in their teens to middle-aged working people to older retirees.

Under the baton of its resident director Henry Hansen for the past seven years, the band is well known locally for its rousing performances of Sousa marches and popular show music. Mr. Hansen is particularly proud of the band's continuing musical development in an ever-expanding repertoire of historical folk music.

The band performs free concerts throughout the year for many events, such as the Fourth of July and Constitution Day parades. This year, in conjunction with its annual summer Pioneer Park Picnic Pops Concerts series, the band is presenting four concerts in honor of California's Sesquicentennial celebration of statehood.

The California Gold Discovery to Statehood Sesquicentennial commemorates the 150th anniversary of the discovery of gold in 1848, the Gold Rush of 1849, and the culmination of California's admittance as the 31st state in the Union in 1850.

GUEST CONDUCTOR - G. "MANCHO" GONZALEZ, JR.

G. 'Mancho' Gonzalez, Jr., has a well-deserved reputation in the Sacramento area as a skilled band director, music educator, and trumpeter. Mr. Gonzalez is the director of bands at Cosumnes River College and is the music director of the River City Concert Band. He is an active member of the Sacramento Valley Symphonic Band Association and has been the co-chair of the Youth Artist Award/Scholarship program.

Mr. Gonzalez grew-up in Pacifica, CA, received his B.A. in Music from San Jose SU, and received a Master in Music in Wind Conducting from CSUS, where his primary professor was Robert Halseth. He has also studied with conductors such as Frederick Fennell, Eugene Coporon, Jack Stamp, Allan McMurry, John Whitwell, and Gary Hill.

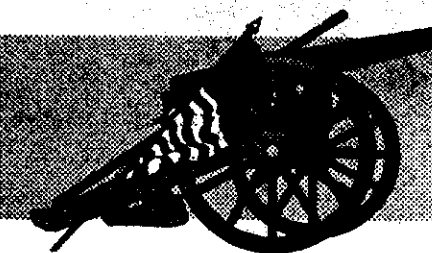
As a trumpeter, he has played in many chamber music ensembles and bands since 1980, as well as with the California Wind Orchestra and the Sierra Nevada Winds Orchestra. His trumpet teachers include Chris Bogios and Gary Dilworth.

For the past four summers he has proudly guest-conducted the NCCB. He has also guest-conducted several regional community bands, the CMEA Region 5 High School Honor Band, and the San Joaquin County Junior High Honor Band. In the fall, "Mancho" will be attending Arizona SU in pursuit of a Doctorate in Musical Arts.
