The Nevada County Concert Band began in the 1850's as an all-brass band organized by Cornish miner immigrants that played for parades and community celebrations. The Nevada County Concert Band grew out of these roots and developed into one of the most active bands in the region. It is a group of 50 community volunteers having different backgrounds and levels of musical experience, whose ages range from young students in their teens to middle-aged working people and older retirees.

Under the baton of its resident director Henry Hansen for the past seven years, the band is well known locally for its rousing performances of Sousa marches and popular show music. Mr. Hansen is particularly proud of the band's continuing musical development in an ever-expanding repertoire of historical folk music.

The band performs free concerts throughout the year for many events, such as the Fourth of July and Constitution Day parades.

GUEST CONDUCTOR - GENE GRAVES

Gene Graves is a graduate of San Jose State University, with a Master's Degree in Music. He chaired the Humanities Division of Chabot College where he taught a wide range of classes ranging from Music Appreciation, History of Jazz, Band, Orchestra, Jazz Band, and Percussion. His interests in music, reflected in his professional pursuits, run the spectrum from Renaissance to Bebop jazz. Mr. Graves is also a highly respected choral conductor with an exceptional knowledge of church literature.

For the last ten years Mr. Graves has been involved with the Asian Youth Orchestra based in Hong Kong. This exceptional group has concertized in eleven Asian countries and in Germany, France, Italy, Spain, the Netherlands, and Switzerland, as well as in the United States at Carnegie Hall and the Hollywood Bowl. Gene and his wife, Marylin, are retired and live in Lake Wildwood.

CONCERT ANNOUNCER - JACK STEWART

In addition to being a clarinetist, Jack Stewart is also the Voice of the NCCB, adding his sometimes ribald, usually humorous, but always informative commentary to our programs. Jack has been involved with the Nevada County Concert Band since 1987. Years before that, after playing in some school groups, Jack was a member of the 10th Olympiad Band for the 1932 Los Angeles Olympic Games. In 1955, after a 20 year hiatus, Jack joined the Aahmes (Oakland) Shrine Temple band and later played in the Castro Valley Community Band, followed by the Walnut Creek Concert Band.
