Victorian Christmas Concert at the Foundry

The Nevada County Concert Band will perform a free concert of holiday music at the Miners Foundry, 325 Spring St. on Wednesday, Dec. 19th. The concert, performed in conjunction with Nevada City's celebration of Victorian Christmas, will begin at 6 p.m.

Cheryl Baker, who is well known in the local musical community, will be the guest conductor. "The Band is just one element that one thinks of when thinking of Nevada County; Christmas celebrations, living history at the Mine, parades, and concerts in the park." Baker is an accomplished choral, hand bell, and orchestral conductor, as well as a vocalist, published composer, and hand bell clinician. She is

a member of the Sierra Symphony, teaches music privately, and assists at Nevada Union High School's music department. Baker, her husband Cris, and children Kimberley and Kevin live in Grass Valley.

Baker has selected a diverse program that includes three selections from Tschaikowsky's "Nutcracker Ballet," Irving Berlin's "White Christmas" featuring Casey Dax on alto saxophone, and a medley of Christmas sing-along music composed by Leroy Andersen. There will also be a special presentation for the children, recounting the story of Santa's toy workshop. Baker adds, "We are playing seasonal favorites that only a band could play! For instance, "Sleigh Ride."


For more than a decade, the Nevada County Concert Band has performed during one of the Victorian Christmas events in Nevada City - usually the Ione Sunday event.
