It currently consists of a core of 40 to 60 community volunteers with varying backgrounds in the musical arts and whose members range from teens to retirees. True to its original charter, the band still performs mostly for parades and community events, including its Pioneer Park Picnic Pops Summer Series and annual appearances at the local Nevada County Fair, the Independence Day Parade and the Constitution Day Parade.
