The Nevada County Concert Band owes its origin to Cornish miner immigrants from England. These Englishmen founded a number of all-brass bands in the Grass Valley/ Nevada City, California, area, during the Gold Rush era of the 1850's. In those days, the bands played for parades and community celebrations.

The present organization, restarted in 1970, has grown from these roots and has developed into one of the most active musical groups in the region. It is a group of 40 to 60 community volunteers with varying backgrounds in the musical arts and whose members range from teens to retirees. True to its original charter, the band still performs mostly for parades and community events, including its annual appearance at the local Nevada County Fair, the Fourth of July Parade, and the Constitution Day Parade. The high lights of the year are the band's Picnic Pops Concerts held at the Pioneer Park Band Shell in historic Nevada City, CA. See the band's web site at www.nccb.org for details.

The American River College Symphonic Band was founded in 1989 by its conductor, Dr. Les Lehr. Originating as the Sacramento Valley Concert Band in 1968, founded by Ed LaFranchi, Dr. Lehr became Director in 1983. The band increased membership splitting into two groups, and then into three groups with one finding residence at American River College. Grant Parker and John Lillie became the other new Directors.

Dr. Lehr continued the tradition of Carmichael Park Concerts evolving into the two day Festival it now has become. From its inception his bands have been known for high quality performances. As a member of the Sacramento Valley Symphonic Band Association, its members have traveled internationally to Australia, Canada, China, Europe, England, and Russia. Each year the band performs in the community for various events. This is Dr. Lehr's retiring performance with the American River ensemble.

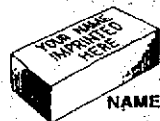

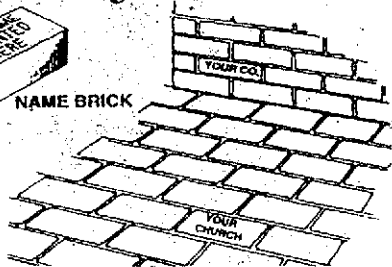
