Patti Carter holds a BA degree in Music Education and Music Theory and has completed post graduate work in conducting. She was a Band Director for 12 years, teaching elementary, junior high and high school students the art of playing ensemble music. During that time, Ms. Carter served as an area Honor Band Director, Adjudicator and Educational Seminar Leader.

Ms. Carter is also an accomplished, professional Bass Trombonist and has completed many professional engagements; among these has been studio recording work in Los Angeles and a long-term stint with the famed Los Angeles Jazz Workshop "A" Band. She and the band traveled and played in 40 states and 6 foreign countries. While a member of these groups, she has performed with many famous musicians and conductors.



Currently, Ms. Carter is a member of the faculty of a Bay Area college as an Emergency Medical Services instructor and works part-time at the Milhous Boy's Ranch. She lives with her husband Ken (The Band Director at Nevada Union High School) and their twin 4 year old boys, Toby and Daniel, in Grass Valley.

Cheryl (Sutton) Baker holds a Bachelors of Music degree in Church Music from Westminster Choir College (Princeton, NJ), with her principle instrument as voice and a minor in organ. She plays many instruments, including violin, piano, recorder, guitar and solo handbells. Cheryl is an accomplished choral, handbell, and orchestral conductor, as well as a vocalist, published composer and handbell clinician.

Most recently Ms. Baker has been the Director of Music at several churches in the San Francisco Bay Area, and is recently past-director of the community choirs Bay Bells and Bay Bells Ensemble which has performed at many events throughout California, Oregon, Nevada, New Mexico, and Hawaii and toured Indonesia in 1996. Cheryl has served on the American Guild of English Handbell Ringers, the tri-state Area XII Board (California, Nevada, Hawaii) since 1990 and is currently the Area XII Chair.

Currently Ms. Baker is a member of the Sierra Symphony, teaches music privately and assists at Nevada Union High School's music department. Cheryl, her husband Cris, and children Kimberley and Kevin live in Grass Valley.

A Brief History

The Nevada County Concert Band owes its origin to Cornish miner immigrants from England. These Englishmen founded a number of all-brass bands in the Grass Valley/Nevada City area during the Gold Rush era of the 1850's. In those days, the bands played for parades and community celebrations.

The present organization grew from these roots and has developed into an active musical group in the region. It currently consists of a core of 40 to 60 community volunteers with varying backgrounds in the musical arts and whose members range from teens to retirees. True to its original charter, the band still performs mostly for parades and community events, including its Picnic in the Park Pops Summer Concert Series and annual appearances at the local Nevada County Fair, the Independence Day Parade and the Constitution Day Parade.
