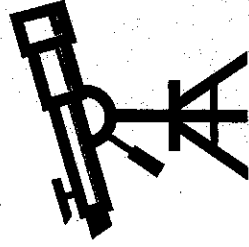

She is a member of the professional group Sonos Handbell Ensemble, which is internationally acclaimed and tours regularly as well as performing with her trio Serenades in Harmony at local weddings/events. Cheryl and her two children live in Grass Valley.
