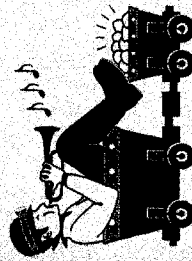

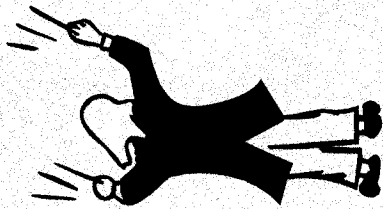
## Join Our Band!

She is a member of the professional group Sonos Handbell Ensemble, which is internationally acclaimed and tours regularly as well as performing with her trio Serenades in Harmony at local weddings/events.
