## NEVADA COUNTY CONCERT BAND HISTORY

The Nevada County Concert Band owes its origin to Cornish miner immigrants from England. These Englishmen founded a number of all-brass bands in the Grass Valley/ Nevada City, California, area, during the Gold Rush era of the 1850's. In those days, the bands played for parades and community celebrations.

The present organization grew from these roots and has developed into one of the most active musical groups in the region. It is a group of 40 to 60 community volunteers with varying backgrounds in the musical arts and whose volunteer members range from teens to retirees. True to its original charter, the band still performs mostly for parades and community events, including its annual appearance at the local Nevada County Fair, the Fourth of July Parade, and the Constitution Day Parade. Playing under the baton of the band's conductor, Cheryl Baker, the band presents a full season of ensemble music to the public.

One of the band's popular entertainment venues is its annual "Pioneer Park Pops" series of concerts, held at Pioneer Park in Nevada City. These three concerts are presented in June, July and August each year. You are invited to prepare a picnic meal, bring your family to the park and listen to the music performed, in the cool early-evening mountain air, by The Nevada County Concert Band.

### CHERYL BAKER

Cheryl (Sutton) Baker is an accomplished choral, hand bell, and orchestral conductor, as well as a vocalist, published composer, and hand bell clinician. She has been a church music director in the San Francisco Bay Area, and is the past-director of the community ensemble Bay Bells which toured California, Oregon, Nevada, New Mexico, Hawaii and Indonesia.

Cheryl holds a Bachelors of Music degree in Church Music from Westminster Choir College (Princeton NJ), with her principle instrument as voice, and a minor in organ, and plays many instruments. In addition to being the conductor of the Nevada County Concert Band, Cheryl is a member of the Sierra Symphony, teaches music privately, and substitute teaches throughout the Nevada County school district. Cheryl is also the conductor of the Auburn Community Band, serves on the Area XII Board of the American Guild of English Handbell Ringers (AGEHR), and owns a small music publishing company, Bronze:FX. Cheryl and her two children live in Grass Valley.
