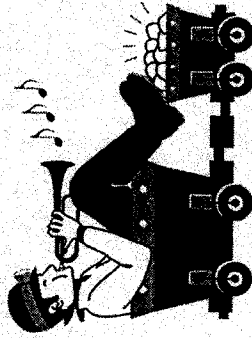

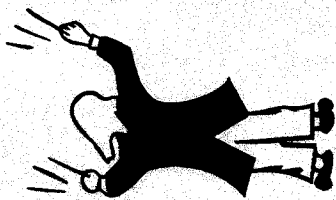

In addition to being the conductor of the Nevada County Concert Band, Cheryl is a member of the Sierra Symphony, teaches music privately, plays occasionally with the Auburn Symphony and substitute teaches throughout the Nevada County school district. Cheryl is also the Music Instructor (strings and youth orchestra) at Yuba River Charter School and owns a small music publishing company Bronze:FX. She is a member of the professional group Sonos Handbell ensemble, which is internationally acclaimed and tours regularly. Cheryl also performs locally at wedding/events with her trio Serenades in Harmony. Cheryl and her two children live in Grass Valley, CA.

Jim Kerr is a graduate of San Jose State University with a BA in Philosophy. After graduation he served in the Air Force. Over his 20 years of service, Mr. Kerr saw duty in Ohio, Vietnam, Thailand, Virginia, Germany and finally California.
