Cheryl has served many years at the national and local levels within the American Guild of English Handbell Ringers (www.agehr.org), is an active member of the professional handbell ensemble Sonos (www.sonos.org), and often sits in with the Auburn Symphony (www.auburnsymphony.com). She teaches music privately and at Clear Creek and Yuba River Charter schools, and she substitute teaches throughout the Nevada County school district. Cheryl lives in Grass Valley, CA, and is a member of the music fraternity Sigma Alpha Iota. She also owns Bronze:FX, a music publishing company (www.bronzefx.com).
