CHERYL (SUTTON, BAKER) WOLDSETH, OUR CONDUCTOR, is currently performing in Estonia and Finland with the Sonos Handbell Ensemble (www.sonos.org), and will return for our other summer concerts.

GENE GRAVES, GUEST CONDUCTOR, was a bassoon major and percussion instructor at San Jose State, with graduate work at USC and Pacific University. He has been a Hayward HS teacher, Minister of Music at the First Presbyterian Church in Hayward, Chairman of the Fine Arts Dept. at Castro Valley HS, Instructor/Chairman of the Humanities Division at Chabot College, and played with the San Jose Symphony. Gene has hosted many top bands and performers at student events and festivals. He began the Jazz Band at San Jose State, taught percussion at Cal State Hayward and summer classes at San Francisco State and Chico State. He conducted/toured with the Honor Band of Santa Clara County, developed a bicentennial six-week Salute to Music of America (with 110-voice Gospel Choir) which he conducted for ten more years. He was percussion instructor and conductor with the Asian Youth Orchestra on tour for three weeks throughout Asia, Europe, and USA. Gene retired to Penn Valley with his wife Marylin, serves on the board of Nevada Children's Chorus, and plays gigs here and there with Jazz Masters and Music in the Mountains.
