Cheryl (Sutton, Baker) Woldseth is an accomplished conductor, performer, clinician, and educator. She holds a Bachelor of Music degree in Church Music from Westminster Choir College (Princeton, NJ), with a major in voice and minor in organ, although she plays many other instruments, too. She is the past church music director in the SF Bay Area and the community handbell ensemble Bay Bells, and a past officer of Handbell Musicians of America. She teaches music/drama at several local schools, is a member of the music fraternity Sigma Alpha lota, and owns Bronze:FX, a music publishing company. Cheryl lives in Grass Valley, CA.
