## BAND MEMBER SPOTLIGHT-JANET SHELLEY



Instruments: Flute, Piccolo, Piano

I love music! My first lessons were on piano at age 7, and by age 10 I began the flute. My wonderful orchestra teacher Sister Teresa for Holy Names High School (Oakland, CA) and my flute teacher John Darasch steered me toward a life in music. But I was a bit of a troublemaker, and didn't get along well with the nuns. My musical education at UC Berkeley was interrupted by marriage, followed by a move to Germany and three children. Returning to the SF/Oakland area, I took my kids to Holy Names College for music lessons, and they tried their best on harp, guitar, trumpet, piano (none of it stuck), but I returned to flute and piano in their orchestra. Being just a few credits short, the college offered to complete my degree if I would perform a recital. The thought made me want to die! So they granted me an honorary teaching degree anyway, and I taught piano

for 16 years. My kids are my biggest fans, but I'm still the only musical one in my family. However, my daughter and I once had parts in the Nutcracker, and I was the little mouse that cried.

And I still love music – joy, satisfaction, and many good friends. Thirty years later, I took flute lessons from Gene Gaddini, also joining the Nevada County Concert Band (Gaddini was conductor 1989-1993). Moving to central California, I joined the Fresno Community Concert Band and the Clovis Community Band. Returning in 2007, I rejoined the NCCBand. While talking with fellow NCCBand flute player Alice Margraf, I discovered that we are distantly related. Small world! And I play flute for my church choir at St. Patrick's Catholic Church, and love card games and doing Tai Chi.

Janet's friends say that she's a sweet and wonderful lady filled with love, laughter, quiet strength, and a little bit of mischief. Janet brightens your day just by being there!

An oboe and English horn player, Jerry was an active member of the Nevada County Concert Band. This scholarship was established to honor Jerry's memory to promote development of young musicians in our community, to benefit local music education programs, and to support local private music teachers.

Congratulations to **Rebekah Shuholm** (trumpet) and **Braeden Ames** (flute, piccolo, oboe, trombone, mallets), who have been awarded the 2016 scholarships of \$1000 each. Rebekah performs today with the Nevada County Concert Band, and Braeden will do so in August.



Rebekah Shuholm has just graduated from Nevada Union High School, and began playing trumpet in fourth grade because it was the loudest and shiniest instrument. Her private trumpet teacher Glenn Smith has propelled her musical career to all sorts of different places. This includes competing in Music in the Mountains Young Musician's Competition, being part of the orchestra pit for Sierra Stages' "The Producers" and this summer's "Little Shop of Horrors", plus winning first chair for the top band at All-State her junior year. This fall, she will continue her studies at St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN, where she will major in trumpet performance.
